JOINT REGULATION

No. 29
of 1973.

Provide for a surcharge on imported goods.

MADE by the Resident Commissioners under Articles 2 (2) and the Anglo-French Protocol of 1914.

1. A surcharge of one per centum (1%) shall be levied on the value of all goods imported into the New Hebrides which are liable to Customs Import Duties as prescribed by the Customs Import Duties Joint Regulation No. 19 of 1963 as from time to time amended (hereinafter called the Joint Customs Regulation).

2. (1) The surcharge shall be calculated at the rate of one per centum (1%) of the value of the goods imported into the New Hebrides as declared for the purpose of import duties levied thereon under the provisions of the Joint Customs Regulation.

(2) Any imported goods in respect of which no duty is levied under the Joint Customs Regulation shall not be liable to the surcharge levied under this Regulation.

3. The Controller of Customs shall, when he notifies any person importing goods into the New Hebrides of their assessment to import duty, also notify the said person of the amount of the surcharge payable in respect of the said goods, and the sums payable in respect of both the import duty and the surcharge shall be payable together with the other.

4. Any person who fails to pay in respect of any imported goods the tax required to be paid under the provisions of this Regulation shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction therefor to a fine not exceeding 25,000 FNH or the equivalent thereof in Australian dollars at the official rate of exchange.

5. This Joint Regulation may be cited as the Joint Import Duties (Surcharge) Regulation No. 29 of 1973 and shall come into force on the date of its publication in the Condominium Gazette.
