JOINT REGULATION

No. 11 of 1978

TO PUT INTO EFFECT the Resolution of the Representative Assembly No. 9 of 1978, passed the 28th day of July 1978, to amend the Joint Local Government Regulation No. 1 of 1975.

MADE by the Resident Commissioners under the provisions of Articles 2:2 and 7 of the Anglo-French Protocol of 1914 and Article 28 (3) of the Exchange of Notes made at London the fifteenth day of September 1977 between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the French Republic.

Scheduled Resolution put into effect. 1. The Resolution of the Representative Assembly No. 9 of 1978, set forth in the Schedule, is hereby put into effect.

Short title and commencement. 2. This Joint Regulation may be cited as the Local Government (Amendment) Regulation 1978 and shall come into operation on the date of its publication in the New Hebrides Government Gazette.

RESOLUTION NO.9 OF 1978

relating to Municipal Elections and By-Elections

The Representative Assembly of the New Hebrides, at its sitting on the 28th day of July, 1978 hereby resolves and decides, in accordance with Articles 23 and 25 of the Exchange of Notes of the fifteenth day of September 1977, to adopt the following measures -

S.10 JR 1/1975.

1. Section 10 of the Joint Local Government Regulation No. 1 of 1975 is amended -

- (a) by deleting in subsection (1) the word "three" and substituting therefor the word "four";
- (b) by adding in subsection (2) after the words "to be represented" the words: "so however that in the year 1978 and in the year ending on the 15th day of August 1979 no by-elections shall be required for vacancies in either of those Municipal Councils unless the number of such vacancies shall equal or exceed half the number of seats in the Council affected, or, unless any ward therein shall be unrepresented."
